# Level 6 Communications & Literature: Course Guide

# **Reading**

- \* You will complete 2 RUAE assessments.
- You will focus on developing the skills to answer RUAE questions successfully
- These will not be completed under timed conditions.

# **Writing**

- You will write a Critical Essay in response to a text you have studied in class. You will have notes to support you and this will not be completed under timed conditions.
- \* You will write a report on a topic of your choosing.

# **Talking**

- \* You will participate in a group discussion. The focus of this discussion will be a text you have previously studied in class. You will be allowed notes to support you in the assessment.
- \* You will deliver a solo presentation. This will be in response to a text you have previously studied in class. You will have notes to support you while completing this.

#### Listening

- You will complete 2 listening assessments.
- One will be in response to listening to a single speaker.
- The other will respond to a discussion of different views and opinions.
- These will not be completed under timed conditions.

### **Textual Analysis**

- You will complete one textual analysis assessment.
- You will answer a series of questions on a previously unseen text.
- You will not complete this under timed conditions.

#### <u>Assessment</u>

- \* There is no final exam for the Level 6 Communications and Literature course.
- \* You must pass all 9 assessments to achieve the qualification.
- \* Achieving Level 6 Communications and Literature is the equivalent to a C pass at Higher.
