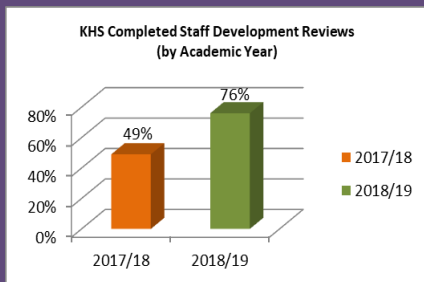

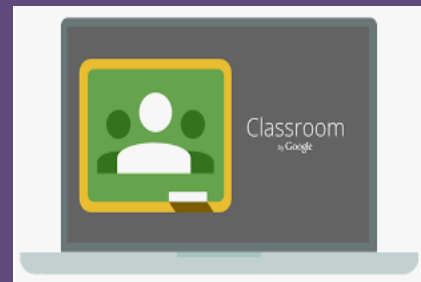

Leadership and Management



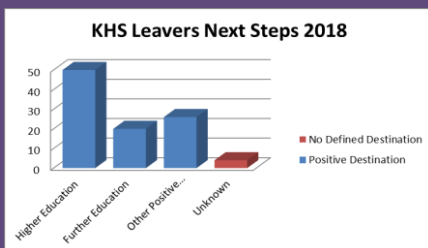
- 76% of staff completed Staff Review and Development discussions with their line manager
- Professional learning is now linked to ERD outcomes
- Principal Teachers participated in SCEL* Middle Leadership Programme which continues in 2018/19
- All Four Probationer Teachers achieved the standard for Full GTCS registration

Learning Provision



- Google Classroom initiative connecting teachers and pupils positively received
- Visible classroom and visible teaching strategies introduced across the school

Success and Achievement



- Overall Improvement in HIGIOS Category
- 96% of leavers moving on from school to a positive destination***
