# National 5 English: Course Guide

## **Writing Folio**

- You will write 1 piece either discursive or creative.
- \* These will be planned, developed and drafted over the course of N5.
- \* The Writing Folio is sent to the SQA in March and is 30% of your overall N5 grade.

#### Reading for Understanding, Analysis and Evaluation (RUAE)

- \* This is Paper 1 of the exam—you will have 60 minutes.
- You will read a passage and answer a series of questions that ask you to show your <u>U</u>nderstanding of the text, <u>A</u>nalyse the language used by the writer and <u>E</u>valuate it effectiveness.
- \* The RUAE Paper is 30% of your overall N5 grade.

### **Scottish Set Text**

- \* This is the first section in Paper 2 of the exam—Critical Reading. You will have 45 minutes for this part of the paper.
- \* In the paper, you will have the whole text/an extract from the text/s you have studied and will answer a series of questions based on the extract.
- \* The final question asks you to compare the given text/extract with another text or part of the text, focusing on a key theme or idea
- \* This Scottish Set Text section of Paper 2 is 20% of your overall N5 Grade.
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### Critical Essay

- This is the second section of Paper 2 of the exam—Critical Reading. You will have 45 minutes for this part of the paper.
- You will be required to write 1 essay in response to a text you have studied in class.
- \* You will not have the text with you.
- \* The Critical Essay section of Paper 2 is 20% of your overall N5 Grade.

## **Spoken Language Assessment**
